Preaching events, worship, and sessions on topics of interfaith collegiality, solidarity among followers of Jesus, and congregational purpose are just some of highlighted themes and opportunities for engaging with the Eden community April 5th -April 9th.

The "I AM Eden" video series continues this week, and highlights the work and stories of faculty, staff and alumni. Listen as Dr. Krause talks with Eden's Rev. Dr. Damayanthi Niles. Dr. Niles is Eden Seminary's interim Academic Dean and Professor of Constructive Theology. Dr. Niles is the author of "Doing Theology with Humility, Generosity and Wonder: A Christian Theology of Pluralism." You will be inspired by this interview, which is a wonderful collection of Dr. Niles' theology and pedagogy as a theological educator at Eden.

"This Week in Eden History," presented by the Archives at Eden, spotlights Eden students who joined a civil rights demonstration in Alabama. On March 7, 1965, a day known as "Bloody Sunday," 600 unarmed individuals were attacked as they began marching from Selma to Montgomery. On March 8, 1965, the Eden community met to discuss how it might respond. Ready the full story here.
