Billy empowers people by building grassroots bases for issue-based campaigns and developing grassroots leaders. He has a long history of engaging voters of color in electoral politics and fighting voter suppression, including organizing voters in Georgia's most recent gubernatorial campaign.

Billy holds a Master of Divinity degree from the Interdenominational Theological Center and a Master of Theology degree from Emory University. He was a Religion and Racial Justice fellow with the Aspen Institute and selected as one of the 500 Most Powerful Leaders in Atlanta by the Atlanta Magazine in 2021 and 2022.
