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# Registration for Spring 2024

## Spring 2024 Schedule

The notes below will help you to better understand the course schedule. Please take a moment to read through these notes before proceeding to the registration form.

- We have expanded our cross-registration offerings through a Course Sharing Collaborative with 4 different seminaries. The courses available to Eden students in the Spring 2024 term are listed on the course schedule and highlighted in blue. ***Pay particular attention to the term dates (shown on the bottom of the course grid) as they may be different than Eden's term dates.***
- A **Course Key**, describing the course numbering system and course modalities, is included in this packet.
- The **Spring 2024 Course Catalog** contains course descriptions for courses being offered this term.
- **Proctor Conference 2024** will take place in Chicago, IL – February 19-22, 2024. Students are expected to register for the conference and cover transportation/lodging on their own. ***This is in-person only.***

## READING THE COURSE SCHEDULE

- There are multiple course modalities represented on the schedule. They are defined in the document titled **Course Key** with the other registration materials.
- You will note the instruction mode in parenthesis after the course title. Be sure to reference the Course Key info to be sure you are selecting the appropriate course for your needs.
  - Ex: B102A Old Testament (B) *McCann* indicates that this course is a Blended (in person and on-line students; synchronous) course
  - Ex: B102A Old Testament (GA) *McCann* indicates that this course is a Guided Asynchronous course.
- You will also note that the morning, afternoon, and evening times are varied for many of the classes. You will see just above the class (or classes) the synchronous meeting times for the course(s) in that block.
  - The example below shows Tuesday afternoon course offerings. While MTS Seminar I and MAPS/MCL Seminar I meet from 2:00-3:30pm, Public Pastoral Care meets from 2:00-5:00p.
