
You'll leave the workshop with **concrete action steps** to start the work of revitalizing your church or community organization. This might be the best few hours you invest in your church's growth all year.

Upcoming Workshop: Church Vitality & Organizing

Rev. Dr. Linda Noonan has spent the last thirty-five years of ministry between South Africa and the United States and serves as Senior Pastor at St. John's United Church of Christ in Lansdale, Pennsylvania. On appointment with the United Church Board for World Ministries, she served as Chaplain to Inanda Seminary (a girls' residential school in a township outside Durban) and Lecturer in Theology at the University of Durban Westville in South Africa. She has a PhD in Religion and Social Change at United Lutheran Seminary in Philadelphia, where she is also an adjunct professor, teaching public theology, faith-based community organizing, and ritual. She is currently writing a book on the power of people organizing together across lines of faith and race to create change in their communities.

She serves as Co-Chair of the national UCC Palestine-Israel Network, which works for a just peace in Palestine. She writes biblical commentary for the "Liturgy That Matters" series of "Enfleshed," and is on the Editorial Board of the Community Organizing Journal. She lives on Lenapehoking land in Philadelphia, PA.
